She also heads the medicine-pediatrics residency quality improvement curriculum and is an investigator in a multi-site NIH research project for vaccine hesitancy. She completed residency in combined internal medicine and pediatrics at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center where she also completed the UPMC Medical Education Program. Dr. Delaney received her medical degree at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan, where she had a focus in urban underserved medicine. She is originally from southeastern Michigan and completed her undergraduate degree in Biology with high honors at the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor.
